We share this as we know we have had discussions with parents who are wanting to attend but haven't get secured a place. Children are eligible for 15 hours funding (or 30 hours if working and eligible), the term after their 3rd birthday.

If they are eligible for a golden ticket/2 year old funding (a family worker would let you know), a child can start as soon as they are 3 years old.
